Monolophosaurus

An early theropod that lived 170 million years ago, in the Jurassic period, the *Monolophosaurus* was quite large and would have been a fearsome opponent. Its name means “single-crest lizard,” and the crest on its skull might have been useful in attracting a mate or warning off other dinosaurs. This 7.5-foot high, 16.5-foot long cast will be on display at The Field Museum’s ***Dinosaur Dynasty: Discoveries from China***, running May 27, 2005 through April 23, 2006. Encounter the dramatic dinosaurs of China, one of the world’s hottest spots for dinosaur discovery. See authentic fossils and life-size casts from all three periods of the Mesozoic era, and gain new insights into the creatures that ruled China for 165 million years.
