This massive *Majungatholus* skull is one of the best-preserved dinosaur skulls ever discovered. Thanks to new technology, scientists have been able to study these and other fossils to glean more information about the evolutionary processes that brought about single-celled organisms and human beings. These processes come to life in *Evolving Planet*, which leads visitors through more than 4 billion years of life on Earth. In addition to fossils, exhibition highlights include videos of Field Museum scientists, recreated prehistoric landscapes and the Museum's famed Charles Knight murals, which serve as a dramatic backdrop for the exhibition.
